HUD FUNDING PROCESS 2019

- GA-507 COC ESTIMATED ANNUAL RENEWAL DEMAND (ARD)- \$3,357,485
- 94% of TIER 1 PROJECTS TOTALS-\$3,170,768
- COC BONUS PROJECT-\$167,874
- DV-\$186,982
- COC PLANNING-\$100,725

- **RANKING PROCESS** As in previous years, the Continuum of Care must rank/prioritize all projects (except CoC Planning projects) in Tier 1 or Tier 2.
 - Tier 1 is 94% of the ARD (\$3,170,768)

CSAH is the CoC collaborative applicant for GA-507. Renewal projects to be submitted are listed above. CSAH is also accepting proposals from agencies that have not been previously funded or that are not currently funded and wish to apply for funding as outlined below.

Funding under the NOFA must be through the reallocation process (shifting funds from existing eligible renewal projects to create new projects) or through the CoC bonus or DV bonus projects.

NEW PROJECTS CREATED THROUGH REALLOCATION OR COC BONUS PROJECTS INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING:

- 1) Permanent Housing-Permanent Supportive Housing projects
- 2) Permanent Housing-Rapid Rehousing projects
- 3) Joint transitional housing and permanent housing-rapid rehousing projects (TH/PH-RRH)
- 4) Dedicated HMIS project for which only the HMIS lead is eligible
- 5) Supportive services only (SSO-CE project) to develop or operate a coordinated entry system. NO OTHER SUPPORTIVE SERVICES PROJECTS WILL BE CONSIDERED.

NEW PROJECTS CREATED THROUGH THE DV BONUS

- 1) Permanent housing-Rapid Re-housing projects that are dedicated to serving survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking.
- 2) Joint Transitional Housing and PH-RRH projects that are dedicated to serving survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking.
- 3) Supportive Services Only-Coordinated Entry project to implement policies, procedures, and practices that assists the CoC's coordinated entry system to better meet the needs of survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking.

EXPANSION PROJECTS

HUD will provide funding for expansion projects to expand existing projects that will increase the number of units, beds or services dedicated to persons eligible to be served with DV Bonus funding.

Interested applicants should read the entire 2019 NOFA in order to understand the requirements for each project type and applicant and project eligibility requirements. Also, the agency should be able to demonstrate its capacity to carry out the program requirements including experience serving the homeless and managing federal grants. Only non-profit organizations, states, and local governments are eligible to apply. Individuals and for-profit entities can not apply. If accepted, selected applicants will submit an application in E-snaps. All applications will be prioritized for funding by the CoC Ranking Committee and submitted in the Consolidated application to HUD which will make the final award decision.

COC PROJECT RANKING COMMITTEE

Each project submitted will be ranked by the CoC Ranking committee, which consists of the following four (4) members: representatives from the Chatham County Public School System, DBHDD Region 5, Social Apostolate, and the Chatham County Safety Net Planning Council. None of the agencies or organizations represented by these members are submitting applications in the competition.

Projects will be ranked using the Project Performance & CoC Priority Scoring Criteria Tool used in previous competitions with some revisions. This tool, once updated, will be shared with applicants.

<u>TIMELINE: The Collaborative Applicant must submit the FY 2019 NOFA application in e-snaps by 8pm Monday, September 30, 2019.</u>

- <u>Friday, August 30, 2019</u>- All completed **Project Applications** must be submitted in E-snaps to the CoC lead agency.
- <u>Friday, September 13, 2019</u>- CoC Notification to Project Applicants of acceptance, rejection, or reduction in the FY2019 competition

•	Monday, September 30, 2019- HUD Due Date-The Collaborative Applicant will submit the Continuum of Care Consolidated Application, Project Applications and Priority Listings to HUD via E-snaps by September 28, 2019.
